The approved budget would comprise of following conditions:

1. The District will ensure that all the institutions have submitted their institution plan for utilising untied, maintenance, RKS fund as per the guideline and it has been approved by the Hospital Management Committee and the District Health Society.
2. The District shall take up capacity building exercise of VHSC, Rogi Kalyan Samitis.
3. The District shall undertake institution specific monitoring of performance of Sub Centre, PHCs, CHCs, DHs etc.
4. The District shall ensure effective and regular organization of monthly Village Health & Nutrition Days and set up a mechanism to monitor them.
5. The Districts shall fast track the physical infrastructure upgradation under District Health Society.
6. The District need to make the health facilities women and child friendly to ensure that women and new born infants stay in the facility for 48 hrs.
7. The District will issue Block wise approvals of the BHAP in line with the State approval.

Programme Specific Comments

1. The fund for SC, PHC, CHC and DH to be utilised as per the guideline given by the State. The guideline for 2009-10 will be send along with the fund.
2. The MMU and Monitoring & Mobility Guideline enclosed in Annexure II.
3. The outsourcing of DH & SDCH will be done centrally by the State. The District need to engage the regular sweepers for implementing Biomedical Waste Management and other related activities in the hospitals to avail their services.

4. The Urban Health Centre guideline is enclosed here with. The Evening OPD services will not be provided in the Urban Health Centre.
5. The Management Cost is a contingency amount released to the Districts for office contingency or any other activity that is approved by the District Health Society. The approval should be programme specific.
6. On the basis of RCH indicators the district need to give award to the best performing Sub Centre from the given amount. It can select 3 best performing SC and give them award and not cash incentive.
7. The Fund under Family Planning on Accreditation of Private Hospital will only be release, if the hospital have been approved by the District Quality Assurance Committee.
